Mindful that the July 2021 deadline for the completed kits is not that far away, Mary got on with it all – ordering fabric and poppers and then went on to make over 1750 liners, 500 shields and 250 bags!

We are so grateful for her dedication to this cause, which now makes creating over 1000 kits achievable. These kits are earmarked for all the Nyaishozi secondary female students and will be hand carried out to Tanzania by Guildford High Schoolgirls, who will be visiting the community next summer.

Nyakasimbi Secondary School Feminine Hygiene

These kits were donated by Days for Girls U.K. but we will, in future, be able to use stock made up by the ladies of Ashtead – lead by Mary Merrett. Nyakasimbi is the fourth secondary school to benefit from our feminine hygiene programme, which will be expanded next year to include Kajunguti and Ihembe Secondary Schools as well as girls at Nyaishozi Primary. Our aim is that every Nyaishozi schoolgirl will have a Days for Girls kit by 2022.



Life Saving Medical Equipment for Kibogoizi Dispensary

Number one on the equipment wish list of Kibogoizi Dispensary was a suction machine for the maternity unit and they were delighted that Action in Africa was able to help them make that wish come true. The machine, pictured right, was eventually delivered after a long delay due to the Covid 19 restriction of movement.

In addition, we were also able to supply this busy medical centre with a blood pressure machine, which is invaluable for mums to be, who tend to suffer from life threatening anaemia.



Rugu Secondary School Maize Mill

As Rugu Secondary School has developed strong ties with Action in Africa in recent years, we were thrilled to contribute funds to a badly needed diesel maize milling machine. This isolated school boards the majority of its students, and as a result, school land has been given to students so that they can grow their own vegetables.

By owning their mill, the students will be able to grind their own grain to provide their nutritious maize gruel at no cost. Also, the school will be able to charge the local community for milling maize, providing a source of income.
