# <u>Action in Africa Christmas Appeal 2024</u>

Action in Africa is proud to launch our fundraising appeal for 2025. We would like to raise funds to provide rainwater harvest tanks for Kajunguti and Ihembe Secondary Schools as part of our Clean Water For Schools Campaign.

We visited both schools in 2023 and were appalled by the condition of the tanks in use. They were in a dreadful state of decay, with covers crumbling into the tanks and ridden with mosquitos. Students were still using the fetid water to wash and worse, drink. Nyaishozi has ample rainfall during the rainy season to see the schools through the dry season, but to achieve that they must have good sized rainwater harvest tanks that are protected by adequate covers.

Father Hans oversaw the construction of such a tank for Rugu Secondary School in 2022 – it was one of his first major Action in Africa projects on arriving as the new parish priest. He is picture right with Rugu headmaster Mr. Ezekia.

## U.K. Schools support Nyaishozi female students in sport

We are so pleased that the UK schools worked hard to incorporate all the projects on our wish list while visiting Nyaishozi. Sports is an area that is so often overlooked, as the funds always seem to go to more urgent initiatives. This summer footballs kindly donated by Chelsea football club were hand carried to Nyaishozi. The UK students then helped to construct football pitches and netball courts at Kajunguti and Rugu Secondary Schools. ## Work to begin on Resource Room at Ruhinda!

Our 2024 Appeal was to raise funds to provide a resource room for disabled female students at Ruhinda Secondary School. We are delighted to announce that the target of  $\pounds 7,000$  has been reached and work can now begin on refurbishing the derelict classroom earmarked for the project. (Pictured left).

There are nearly 80 girls with varying disabilities who currently have no designated space that accommodates their physical needs. This well-equipped resource room will address this issue and help the girls to reach their full potential.

During our recent visit to Ruhinda Secondary School, it was so refreshing to see the disabled students integrated into mainstream education. This project will further enhance their life chances.
